





The BLM Grand Junction Field Office concluded wild horse gather operations on the Little Book Cliffs Wild Horse Range Sept. 18, 2024. Approximately 140 horses from four areas of the horse range were gathered Sept. 11-18, 2024.

Purpose of Gather:

BLM Colorado is committed to managing for healthy horses on healthy lands through appropriate management levels of the population. The removal of excess wild horses is necessary to achieve the AML of 90-150 horses on the range. It is important to find a balance that will preserve wild horses and their habitat, other wildlife like elk and deer, and natural resources.

BLM Colorado is committed to reducing the frequency of helicopter gathers. This outcome is dependent on having an effective fertility control program to reduce the rate of herd growth (15-20% annually if not managed), which is most successful when used to maintain a population that is within appropriate management levels.

Details of Gather:

During a horse gather, safety is our priority – that of the animals, our employees, and members of the public. BLM is committed to the humane and ethical treatment of wild horses and ensures BLM and contractor staff adhere to guidelines set forth by the <u>Comprehensive Animal Welfare Program</u> in all gathers.

The Comprehensive Animal Welfare Program outlines required best practices and humane handling standards that prioritize the health and well-being of wild horses and minimize potential stress and injury.



2023 Bordo Atravesado HMA Wild Horse Gather

The Bordo Atravesado Herd Management Area wild horse gather concluded on June 24, 2024.

Purpose of Gather:

As of March 2023, the BLM estimated there were approximately 230 wild horses within and outside the herd management area, which is almost four times the number that is healthy for the land and the herd. The purpose of the gather is to reduce wild horse overpopulation by removing excess wild horses from within and outside the Bordo Atravesado, and to reduce the wild horse population growth rates using a temporary fertility control vaccine.

Details of Gather:

The BLM will conduct gather operations using water to attract animals into existing corrals in the area.

Background:

The Bordo Atravesado Horse Management Area is approximately 15 miles northeast of Socorro, New Mexico. A wild horse herd has been present in the area since at least the early 1950s. Bordo Atravesado horses come in an array of colors, which include buckskins, roans, grays, palominos, bays, sorrels, and a few black horses.





George Brauneis Grand Valley Horse Rescue Colorado



Back in 1971, George Brauneis was one of tens of thousands of children that wrote letters to Congress and our President in support of Wild Horse Annie's efforts to better protect our Wild Horses and Burros. He was in the saddle before he could even walk. He grew up with Taffy a beautiful Palomino mare and Old Ed, a scruffy and loveable Mammoth donkey. The love of horses and donkeys, Mustangs and burros runs deep.

After graduating college, he found his way to Long Beach, California where he worked in aerospace engineering. His fingerprints can be found on the International Space Station, the B2 Bomber, the Global Hawk drone, and the C17 to name a few. But, after September 11th, 2001, he had a change of heart and returned to rural Colorado. He came back full circle to his roots of his youth with horses.

George is a master at working with QiGong energy with horses. He has a way of being that mirrors a still lake in his Qi (energy) that helps the horses feel safe and cared for and seen without stressing them out or chasing them around to get them to connect. He calls this "Becoming Catchable To Your Horse."

George is a purely positive trainer who understands the deep energy flow of Qi running through him, the horses and burros and all of the animals at the Eagles and Wild Horses Ranch. His practice of QiGong led him to discover that Qi is a horse's natural language and by matching his Qi state with the horses amazing results were possible that allow the horse to shift their behaviors naturally and with very low stress.

George has come to develop his own unique style of "Slow Dancing" with the Mustangs which allows them to trust him based on their choice of being able to connect with him when they are ready. George's primary concern is the restoration of each horse's essence which so often becomes shut down at the hands of humans. Even though they may have experienced great trauma they can once again learn to feel safe in their own bodies and trust humans again.


Paige Burham Colorado

Tim McGaffic Colorado







Takhin Equine Integration

The training of the horse as it's own human therapeutic intervention.

If a horse is going to transmit well-being to a human, it must have well-being to give. This applies to both horses in therapy settings as well as horses in riding schools, and sport.

Takhin is the Mongolian word for the wild horse – it means "honored one" or "revered one". The Takhin program honors the horse's need for play, herd socialization, purpose, and bodily and mental development.

It also honors the equine professional who is trying to do their best for their horse and clients, but often lack the time to address both.

Takhin is a program that will enable you to teach your clients with trauma, depression and related conditions to work with equine play, lunging, in hand work and long reins, to not only ensure the horses's well-being but to also empower themselves.

Scott Beckstead Wild Horse Refuge Colorado



Scott Beckstead, the Chief Equine Programs Director at the Wild Horse Refuge in Colorado. The horses share this vast swath of rangeland with multiple native wildlife species, providing a balanced and diverse ecosystem for all. Attendees will learn about the sanctuary's comprehensive approach to wild equine care, land and wildlife stewardship, and the crucial role of community involvement and support. The Wild Horse Refuge not only aims to provide sanctuary for Colorado wild horses, but also to educate the public and promote sustainable coexistence with wild horses and the other wild denizens of the range.

Patrick Craig Wild Horse Refuge Colorado



Founder and Executive Director – Pat Craig – Pat began saving captive wildlife after learning that thousands of "surplus" animals were being kept in tiny cages in the back of zoos all across the country – with many being euthanized on a daily basis. Pat set out on a mission to help save these animals by building a small rescue facility on his family farm outside Boulder, CO. At age 19, Pat became the youngest state and federally licensed person in the country, as well as the first person to build a sanctuary dedicated to saving large carnivores and other animals.

Pat's vision has led 44 years later to the oldest and largest nonprofit sanctuary in the world dedicated to rescuing captive exotic and endangered large carnivores that have been abused, abandoned, exploited or illegally kept. Beginning in 2022, Pat saw the need for a wild horse refuge to be created in order to help wild Mustangs in Colorado. He subsequently created the largest wild horse sanctuary in the United States by opening a 22,500-acre facility in northwest Colorado for Mustangs that were being removed from their native ranges by the BLM.

Pat's 44 years of experience in captive large carnivore rescue, transportation, animal behavior and sanctuary development have led to his becoming a leading expert in the field. He spent more than a decade rescuing PMU horses back in the late 80's and early 90's and has rescued hundreds of horses in need while also operating three separate large carnivore sanctuaries.

Pat lectures regionally and nationally on captive wildlife rescue and transportation, great cat behaviors and diets, and has worked tirelessly toward better protection for these animals. He works hand-in-hand with the USDA, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Colorado Division of Wildlife, and many other state and national organizations in the never-ending fight to rescue animals in need. Pat has also worked with Canadian, Mexican, Spanish, Bolivian, Uruguayan, Panamanian and Peruvian, Lebanese and Korean government agencies on large and extremely complicated rescues from within their countries.

Pat oversees and participates in all TWAS' operations, including rescues, both within the United States and abroad. Pat has over 44 years of experience in designing, building and operating specialized rescue equipment for use in transporting large carnivores and wild horses and manages the largest fleet of rescue equipment in the country. His expertise in handling large rescues in demanding situations, as well as successfully covering great distances is well known among law enforcement agencies across the U.S.

Pat has a BS in Education from the University of Northern Colorado and has received recognition and awards from many sources including the United States Secretary of Agriculture Honor Award for service above and beyond to the USDA, the American Veterinary Medical Association, the American Humane Association and E-Chievement Award from E-Town Environmental Radio Show. Besides being featured as a modern-day Noah by 60 minutes news, Pat was also a finalist in Animal Planet's "Hero of the Year" selections and currently has two Emmy Awards for educational videos he helped produce.


10th Mt Equine PANEL: Mustangs, First Responders & Veterans Mustangs For Mental Health

Russell is deeply involved in the equine world and together with Alecz Adams, operates Granger Equine, a horse ranch located 6 miles off-grid high in the Colorado mountains at 9300 feet above sea level. He also serves as one of the founding directors for 10th Mountain Equine, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that provides a variety of Equine Assisted Services.

Russell continues to lecture, now mostly related to Equine Assisted Therapy. In 2019 Russell presented at the Colorado Judicial Conference regarding evidence-based support for equine therapy and how equines may be used in the Colorado Court System. 

A life-time of working with horses started my research on Pre-Columbian horses in the Americas.

Shortly after moving to Pagosa Springs, Colorado in the fall of 1978, I met Bob Browning, the iconic Horse Whisperer of San Juan County. I had been a horseback riding instructor since my youth, but it was with Bob Browning where I learned horsemanship through Ray Hunt, John Lions and others. I worked with Bob Browning for 40-years using breed horses and the mustangs to improve attitude in youth of the Navajo Nation and other school, court, church, college, university, FFA, 4H and Boys and Girls club programs.

Special to my journey with horses and my research of them was working alongside Bob Browning in his 1990 initiative to revive the interest of the Appaloosa breed among the youth of the Nez Perce; riding the 1300-mile Chief Joseph Trail Ride where many oral history stories were told.

The Bob Browning Ranch became the number one mustang collection and adoption agency as he partnered with bait-trapper Dan Elkins in a contract with the Jicarilla Forest Ranger District; I had the honor to work with Bob and Dan to support an alternative to menacing all-terrain vehicles and helicopters to round up mustangs. It would be 2013 when Bob Browning and I introduced Laura Harper to Dan Elkins at a local café for her to learn his age-old but, at the time, novel method of bait and trap to be documented in Mustang of the Carracas Mesa. I continue my research to answer the question Bob and I often entertained that continues to drive me back to the past to find the answer, "What came first in the domestication of the horse?"



Ann Souders Texas Forever Branded



After many years in corporate America, Ann attended her first Extreme Mustang Makeover in 2007 which inspired both she and her husband to compete the following year. A member of several prominent activist groups, Ann began talking to the BLM and Mustang Heritage Foundation personnel at the EMM events and spending time with many knowledgeable horsemen and women throughout her time training for the EMM. These conversations opened her eyes to another view of the plight of America's wild horses and burros and led her to cut ties with the activist organizations and look for ways to educate others. The art of conversation comes easily to Ann so, in 2009, when Mustang Heritage Foundation invited her to join them, she jumped at the chance.

She began traveling the US with America's Mustang, MHF's educational initiative visiting schools, equestrian events and spreading the truth surrounding wild horse and burro management practices. Her name has become synonymous with America's Mustang, Mustang Heritage Foundation and now the Director of Outreach and Education for Forever Branded. The Wild Horses living on this special property are now protected and have regained the freedom and independence they had prior to government interference.

With more than 29 square miles of contiguous land to run free, their wild and free spirit has been restored. With the Refuge being located just 30 miles from the Sand Wash Basin, the horses feel right at home as they roam freely across the vast open spaces of the Refuge!

There are no paddocks, stock pens, fenced pastures, or other smaller and more restrictive spaces in use here. Instead of being relegated to pens or smaller pastures where they might have an occasional opportunity to run one or two hundred yards - or possibly even a few thousand feet... the wild horses living at the Refuge continue to run until they choose to stop.

It is truly a beautiful sight to see when these wild horses are able to regain control of where they go and what they do completely on their own!

The Wild Horse Refuge is a completely new facility that was acquired in order to create a special home for Colorado's native Wild Horses.

Wild horses (Mustangs) are allowed to roam freely within the Refuge - which has more than 22,500 acres of land for the horses to roam freely.

I feel as a film maker and content creator I have a responsibility to audiences to speak honest, compelling stories that entertain, educate, surprise and are cinematically beautiful


HOOVES: Healing America's Veterans Directed by: Josh Nagel 60:00 mins





Mustang of THE CARRACAS MESA: A HISTORY OF THE JICARILLA MUSTANGS AND MUSTANGERS - USA Directed by: Laura Harper 30:00 mins

More than three years ago, Laura Harper began work on a film script about her once-wild mustang, Rambo. As she delved into his life, she found Rambo's story connected the evolution of the horse to New Mexico's history and her own life here in San Juan County. Laura discovered that the horses used by the Conquistadors more than five hundred years ago to traverse New Mexico had an ancient bloodline that is found here today. Amazingly, a 2013 genetic analysis conducted by Dr. E. Gus Cothran, Department of Veterinary Integrative Bioscience, concluded the Old-World Iberian breed is conclusively a genetic marker present in the Jicarilla mustangs of Northern New Mexico and Rambo's DNA as well. By tracing the mustangs' bloodline, a wonderful history of New Mexico—its wild horses and its people— is revealed and vibrantly retold in Laura's film, "RAMBO of the Carracas Mesa: A History of the Jicarilla Mustangs and Mustangers."

The film features local families that represent the diverse culture of Northern New Mexico and their personal relationships with the Jicarilla mustangs. It is through their individual stories that we learn the Jicarilla mustang's historic value to Northern New Mexico's culture. The documentary concludes with the idea that by joining nature, horsemanship, community, science, and technology, there can be a positive future for the mustangs and the approach of the mustangers.


Where Horses Heal The Soul Directed by: Twila LaBar 93:00 mins


